GIFT SUGGESTIONS TO FILL YOUR BOX

Child ~ For Young Children

Cars, trucks, etc. balls, complete ligsaws, action figures, colouring books, pens, crayons, lego blocks, yo-yo, bubble blowers, wooden and plastic toys, building blocks, pencil case, pencil sharpener, dominoes, playdough / plastercine & cutters, fluffy toys, dolls, stickers, writing pads, skipping rope, scarf, mittens / gloves, hat, harmonica, games, cards...

Teenagers ~ For young people up to 18 years age

Sportswear, scarf, gloves, socks, hat, football memorabilia, writing materials, mirror, costume jewellery, make-up, hair brush, toiletries, school stationery, games, playing cards, tenhis ball, tooth brush & paste, deodorants, comb, clothing repair kits, skelich pad, coloured pens / pencils...

Household Goods ~ For Families & Older folk

Scarves, gloves, hats, wrapped soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, disposable razors, shampoo, soap flakes, pan scourers, antiseptic cream, bandages, face or body creams, cosmetics, pens, writing pad & envelopes, Tlights, candles, sewing kit, scissors.

Baby ~ Age up to 12months

This is given to new mothers and can include baby wipes, cotton wool buds, baby shampoo, baby oil, fale powder, bonnet, bootees and mitts, baby grow baby blanket, small soft toy or plastic rattle...

For safety

Protect anything sharp and do not put anything sharp into a Child's box. Please securely sellotape tops of liquid containers.

What NOT to include in boxes

matches, inflammable liquids, inflammable aerosols (e.g.: deodorants & hair spray), seeds or any other living material, automatic washing machine powders, westhing-up liquid (they often leak when laid flat) Food, sweets, chocolate & drinks, battery operated toys, conflict related items.


